PUBLIC EXAMINATION RESULTS

Examination statistics and league tables present only a partial picture of any school. Chase Academy is non-selective, but frequently at the top of the county A level league tables. As a small school, one or two students make a significant difference to the statistics, which shows in the variation in GCSE results.

Raw results hide a range of performances. In 2010, the top GCSE scorer achieved 14 A* grades at GCSE with two A level grade A*'s and an AS level grade A on top - two years early! He might have been the top scorer, but the top performers at GCSE were probably students with much lower grades who scored more than two grades higher than ability tests predicted.

At A level, most of our grades were A and B. In 2010 our strongest student won a Cambridge place two years early, with five A levels and two AS levels all at the highest grades. But, again, perhaps our strongest recent performer was a student who had had problems with dyslexia for years, but still gained four A grades.

At Chase Academy our Grammar School stream achieves outstanding academic results. Alongside them we are even more proud of our pupils of lower ability who achieve results that elsewhere they would never dream of.
